## Legitimacy of contact tracing phone calls

Ithaca, Stanton, St. Johns- With so many COVID-19 scams popping up lately, it's hard to know what is legitimate and what isn't.

If you get a call from your local health department, asking questions related to contact tracing, keep in mind that:

Local health departments will not:

- offer medication for treatment or prevention of COVID-19.
- ask for Medicaid or other insurance information for billing purposes.
- request personal financial information such as a social security number or driver's license number.

Legitimate questions that local health departments will ask when conducting a contact tracing investigation:

- current health status
- symptoms they may be experiencing
- individuals they have been in contact with
- places they have been in recent days
- other health-related questions
