Public Health Nurse I/II, Part-time Position – 4 openings

Mid-Michigan District Health Department is recruiting for **4 part-time Public Health Nurse I/II positions** to provide public health services based on the core competency and essential functions of public health. Hours of work will be **at least 20 hours per week** and may include afternoon, evening, and weekend hours. These positions' bases have yet to be determined but will mainly be telecommuting and will be expected to work districtwide. These positions are part of the Community Health and Education Division and will work under the supervision of that division.

Focus area – Independently conducts disease case investigation and management to individuals infected with COVID-19. Provides services to identified at-risk populations by telephone. Provides district wide consultation and education on COVID-19 mitigation. Encourages the promotion and maintenance of health and the prevention of disease and disability.

This position is currently funded through September 30, 2021.

General Description of Responsibilities:

The public health nurse is responsible for providing the nursing component of agency services and health programs. They exercise a considerable degree of independent and professional judgment in planning for and implementing public health nursing services in the district. Public health nurses are expected to be able to assume leadership roles and may be responsible for some coordination and review of work performed by other professional staff and public health representatives. They must be knowledgeable in assessing community health needs. Nurses must exercise considerable skill in working with clients and their families, other employees and the public; understand traditional public health activities; and, understand chronic disease control and prevention through risk reduction.

Qualifications:

Public Health Nurse I

- Possession of a current license to practice as a registered nurse in Michigan.
- Possession of a valid Michigan vehicle operator's license, own transportation and ability to travel as required.

Public Health Nurse II also requires

- Registered Nurse with a four (4) year degree acceptable to the health officer in a field related to public health service; or, three (3) years public health nursing.
